

SCHOLARSHIPS FROM THE NATIONAL SOCIETY OF PROFESSIONAL ENGINEERS

HIGH SCHOOL SENIORS:

The Maureen L. & Howard N. Blitman Scholarship to Promote Diversity in Engineering (March 1, 2006) will be awarded to a high school senior from an ethnic minority going into an ABET-accredited engineering program at a four-year college or university: \$5000.

UNDERGRADUATE

Auxiliary Scholarship (Female - \$2,000)

The NSPE Educational Foundation 2007 Auxiliaries Scholarship is a \$2000 award. Applicants must be young women engineering students enrolled in the sophomore year of a four-year [ABET](#)-accredited engineering program.

Virginia D. Henry Memorial Scholarship (Female - \$1,000)

The NSPE Educational Foundation 2007 Virginia D. Henry Memorial Scholarship is a \$1000 award. Applicants must be young women students enrolled at a community/junior college, who have been accepted for transfer into a four-year [ABET](#)-accredited engineering program.

The Milton F. Lunch Memorial Internship (Deadline February 15, 2007) will provide 6 weeks of meaningful summer employment at the Victor O. Schinnerer Company in Bethesda, Maryland, to a student who has completed two years of a four-year degree in an ABET-accredited engineering program: \$6,000 stipend.

Professional Engineers in Industry (PEI) Scholarship (March 15, 2007)

Applicants must be sponsored by a NSPE/PEI member. Students who are children, dependents, or relatives of NSPE members are given preference in the scholarship selection process. Students must have completed a minimum of two semesters or three quarters of undergraduate engineering studies (or be enrolled in graduate study) in a program accredited by the Accreditation Board for Engineering and Technology (ABET). \$2500 for one year.

Paul H. Robbins, P.E., Honorary Scholarship (\$10,000 – March 1, 2007)

The Paul H. Robbins, P.E., Honorary Scholarship is awarded annually to a current engineering undergraduate student entering the junior year in an ABET-accredited engineering program and attending a college/university that participates in the NSPE Professional Engineers in Higher Education [Sustaining University Program](#).

William R. Kimel, PE Engineering Scholarship (\$2,500 – March 1, 2007)

The William R. Kimel, P.E., Engineering Scholarship is awarded annually to an undergraduate student who is a resident of either Kansas or Missouri, enrolled as a junior in an ABET-accredited engineering program in a college or university in either Kansas or Missouri. Applicant must be: A permanent resident of Kansas or Missouri, an undergraduate in the junior year enrolled in an ABET-accredited engineering program at a college or university in either Kansas or Missouri

GRADUATE STUDENT

The Steinman Fellowship (\$10,000 - March 1, 2007) will be awarded to a senior from the NSPE Northeast Region (CT, DE, DC, ME, MD, MA, NH, NJ, NY, RI, PS, VT) who will graduate from an ABET-accredited engineering program and enter a graduate program in engineering: \$10,000.

NSPE/PEC George B. Hightower, P.E. Fellowship (March 1, 2006)

NSPE/PEC and the NSPE Educational Foundation have established the George B. Hightower, P.E., Memorial Fellowship Fund to annually honor an outstanding engineering graduate student. \$3000 for one year.

Professional Engineers in Government (PEG) Management Study Fellowship (March 15, 2006)

This is a scholarship for graduate students who are pursuing an MBA, a master's degree in engineering management, or a master's degree in public administration. It is available to any Engineer Intern or licensed Professional Engineer from any discipline. Applicants who are not U.S. citizens may apply if they are current NSPE members. \$2500 for one year.
